• Discussion: Dr. Jesse Crete informed the region that a workgroup is still pending to address the occupations skill levels above the middle. The Center of Excellence does not provide an endorsement with a yes or no. More discussion is needed on these types of program occupations. Mr. John Jaramillo stated that this has caused some confusion because we are limited to associate degrees and below. However, the education we can provide via certificate can greatly assist those with graduate and postgraduate degrees, as well as those who are already working in the industry. The certificates make a lot of sense, but it's unclear how they fit into the curriculum. Dr. Crete agreed with Mr. Jaramillo concerns and mentioned that the OC Center of Excellence is in conversation with the Chancellor's Office for middle skill occupations. Dr. Crete stated that they had wonderful conversations with faculty and administrators in support of the courses, but they admit that the certificates alone would not prepare a student for this type of job. It is expected that these students will come to us with experience and degrees, allowing them to get better jobs or advance to the next level of being prepared for new technology. Lastly, Dr. Crete stated that we must inform our students, or it will be a disservice to them. Mr. Jason Sim agreed with the comments and recommendations made by Dr. Crete. Because Python and Java are the two most popular programming languages used by businesses, certificates in those languages were developed. They are made to provide students with the chance to get a Python Institute certification, which is essentially an industry credential. In order to offer them an advantage and help them pursue careers as Python developers, programmers, or architects, we hope that the students pass the exam. The Oracle corporation will serve as the basis for the Java certification, with the same intention.
