• **Discussion:** Dr. Shelley Blair inquired about the Legal Videographer Certificate program and what it entails. Ms. Margaret Fernandez stated that she does not know much about the program because it came through a different division. Ms. Fernandez will contact faculty and gather additional information to share with this group. Ms. Dorsie Brooks added that she was also interested in the program and discovered online that it is videoing courtroom procedures and depositions, and that there are a lot of law classes. It is, in fact, a very robust certificate. Dr. Jesse Crete added that, in terms of LMI, Cypress College made it in under the wire at the 12-month mark. So we did it in March of last year, and the occupations were court reporters and simultaneous captioners with the 27309 soft and 0514.3 top codes.

## VII. Update, Discussion, and/or Action Item

OCRC Oversight Committee:

Dr. Adriene "Alex" Davis, Executive Director of OCRC

Discussion: Dr. Davis informed the CRLC members that she had convened the oversight committee, and there was some confusion about the intent to apply; some of the questions were; is this intent to apply for the purposes of saying yes or no, whether a project can go forward, or just for informational purposes? There was no agreement reached, but it was recommended that each project that was submitted proceed with full application. Dr. David mentioned that Mr. John Jaramillo raised an excellent point: when you submit an intent to apply or notice of intent, you do not receive a yes or no response from the agency. It's just to let them know you intend to submit a full application. Dr. Davis stated that this group really needs to get this process together and not keep disrupting it, because the information in the full application is all that is required at the Regional Consortium level to say that the projects have passed the litmus test. Dr. Davis also reminded the group that the Governance Council provided us with some guidance and framework for what they expect from the project, such as data-driven, equity-focused, and strong workforce guidelines, which are the seven guiding principles and eligibility criteria. Also, Dr. Davis stressed the importance of the timeline, saying that she has given this group the opportunity to begin developing projects in the fall, and that you should complete the application right away and begin developing the projects involved, because we will not receive our final allocations until the following fall, which is late August or early September. Please keep in mind that participation agreements will not be distributed until the Chancellor's Office has certified the plans in NOVA. Our ultimate goal is to give you more time and allow you to all plan your compression. The deadline to submit applications is May 5<sup>th</sup> 2023.

Mr. John Jaramillo stated that the review committee members are still concerned about the impact of the funds. Please be more specific in NOVA about the impact and outcomes of what you're doing. How many students will get a job, finish a program, or enroll in a program, whatever phase you're doing of the more and better of CTE from an SWP standpoint? They want to see your projections and, at the very least, a reasonable explanation of how you arrived at those expectations. Dr. Shelly Blair stated that there is a disconnect between what the Senior Executive Leadership expects and what is happening on the ground as a result of some of the comments listed on Coastline's intent to apply. In order to answer some of these questions, Dr. Blair asked Dr. Davis what happened to the presentations opportunity. Dr. Davis responded that she is disappointed that the region did not have time to modify your projects, because the last time you presented to the oversight Committee, you were able to go back and modify based on the feedback. Unfortunately, that will not be the case this time. You'll simply submit, and then they'll rate the application. We must stop disrupting the process because it is confusing to all parties involved. Lastly, Dr. Davis shared 2021-2023 SWP Foundation and Regional Projects Funding, Scope, and Metrics.

Ms. Margaret Fernandez stated that knowing when the oversight committee is meeting would be extremely beneficial so that they could meet with their representative and ensure they have some background because that does help with the gap. Dr. Davis stated that is a fantastic comment and that she will create a calendar with all of the relevant meetings pertaining to a strong workforce.

- **10. Santiago Canyon** We are currently looking for an academic affairs Vice President. Enrollment has increased by more than 10%. As SCC expands its Career Education programs, the new president's goal is to transform it into a mid-sized college.
