• Discussion:

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- o Ms. Brooks noted that the data requests for Modern Policing associate degrees have been reinstated on the agenda due to a new TOP code provided by the Chancellor's Office. Ms. Brooks also indicated that two last-minute data requests (#7 and #8) from Santa Ana College were added yesterday. It was clarified that data request #7 pertains to an associate degree in Human Resources Management.
- Mr. Starkman discussed their efforts to enhance the Automotive Hybrid, Electric, and Alternative Fuel Technology Certificate program, which involved a two-year process to renumber all associated courses. They are updating some hybrid courses and incorporating additional electric and hybrid content into existing curricula.
- Or. Foley explained that the Clinical Genetics and Molecular Biology Scientist program is a licensing initiative coordinated with the Orange County Department of Health. Currently, Santa Ana College is assessing this program, as the licensing requirements stipulate a bachelor's degree. This program aims to provide upskilling opportunities for incumbent workers and graduates. Dr. Crete shared that this program aligns with middle-skill technical occupations, specifically clinical laboratory technologists and technicians, and thus fits the educational framework for community colleges. Dr. Foley concurred but highlighted that the specific licensing requirements from the OC Department of Health necessitate a bachelor's degree, and the college is exploring its ability to develop the program under these constraints.

VI. Update, Discussion, and/or Action Item

Ms. Dorsie Brooks, CRLC and Dean Resource Associate, OCRC

a. TOP to CIP Codes

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Ms. Brooks noted a prior discussion concerning the alignment of TOP and CIP codes and expressed her interest in understanding the colleges' current initiatives in this area. She mentioned that Golden West College is concentrating on correcting hours to unit conversions in their curriculum. Ms. Knuppel confirmed that Orange Coast College is undertaking similar efforts. Dr. Crete encouraged anyone with questions or concerns about this process to reach out to the COE, which is assisting with these initiatives. Ms. Brooks expressed her concern about the need to educate faculty and staff on selecting the appropriate CIP codes.

b. Voting Member Responsibilities

Ms. Brooks reported that last week, she, Dr. Crete, and the OCRC team met and recognized that there are several new CRLC members who have not revisited the regional recommendation process in some time. She reviewed the responsibilities of the <u>CRLC Voting Members</u> and will be sending this information to the members via email for their review and feedback. Ms. Irwin suggested adding a section for Alternate Voting Members. Ms. Brooks then shared details about the <u>Program Recommendation Process</u> available on the ocregional consortium.org website. She encouraged members to provide feedback on any challenges they encounter regarding the program recommendation process.

Ms. Brooks proceeded to present the new <u>COE request LMI form</u>. She noted that she has not been receiving confirmation email notifications when requests are submitted using the new form. Dr. Crete acknowledged this issue regarding email confirmation notifications. Ms. Brooks then provided a detailed, step-by-step overview of the COE LMI form. She reminded the members that the deadline for submitting an LMI request is the last day of each month. Ms. Brooks also provided a brief recap of the necessary steps for submitting a new program.

c. Program Recommendation Process- Pain points/Process improvement

Ms. Brooks will be emailing the Program Recommendation Step-by-Step process documents to the members for their review and feedback.

d. COE Updates

Dr. Jesse Crete, OC COE Director

COE has granted a one-time exception: if a request aligns with the same TOP code and occupation as another report completed within the past 12 months, they will reissue the report. This exception is in response to multiple requests from colleges facing imminent curriculum deadlines.

On a different note, Dr. Crete shared that when submitting an LMI request for a baccalaureate degree, it should be selected under the "New Program" category, where the option for "Baccalaureate Degree" is available. The Chancellor's Office has revised the workforce needs component of the baccalaureate degree program application, requiring COE to provide additional data points, such as evidence that employers offer higher salaries for individuals with a baccalaureate degree. The process for creating these reports differs from that of other college programs, and COE now has a shorter timeline of 2-4 weeks to produce these reports. Each report will also need to include a cover letter, which must be uploaded as part of the application. COE encourages members to submit their LMI requests for baccalaureate degree applications at least 90 days before the deadline, which is October 18th. An email with this information has been sent to all members.
