The courses in Landscape Design II are designed to enable students to prepare for exciting careers in the essential and diverse horticulture profession. Careers in nursery management, retail garden centers, landscape design, installation and maintenance, arboretum and botanic gardens, arboriculture, interior landscaping, education, and research are just some of the options. This certificate is part of Mt. SAC's comprehensive agricultural sciences program. The program is unique in that most of the courses provide hands-on experience and are designed to give the student a combination of practical skills and technical knowledge.

- 2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.
  - Mt. SAC's horticulture advisory committee made the recommendation to modify nine certificates and create three new certificates in order to provide students with the opportunity to acquire a greater variety of specific skill sets, increasing the diversity of employment opportunities. The Landscape Design level II Certificate requires completion of Landscape Design Level I certificate course work (18 units) for a total of 36 units.
