The Barber program consists of a minimum of 1500 hours of training to provide entry level skills to students who desire a career in the barbering profession. Students will develop expertise in the science and techniques of hair and skin and lab experience in barbering. Upon completion, the student is eligible to take the California State Board examination to become a licensed Barber.

2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

This certificate will introduce students to core concepts in the field of barbering and prepare them to pass the State Board of Barbering Exam for licensure in Barbering. The creation of this program stems from student inquiries and advisory board recommendation for the past 3+ years. As the trend in Men’s grooming continues to increase, so does the need to meet the demand. (Notes from the advisory board available upon request).

The curriculum for students enrolled in a barbering course shall consists of 1500 clock hours of technical instruction and practical operations covering all practices constituting the art of barbering pursuant to Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act. This shall include demonstration, lecture, classrooms participation, examination, and practical operations. The framework consists of 6 consecutive courses of 7 units each totaling 42 units to complete the certificate. Students who choose to can also complete the requirements that will result in an Associate of Arts degree from the college.

4. Summarize the Labor Market Information and employment outlook (including citation of the source of the data) for students exiting the program.

Using the data provided by our Center of Excellence from EMSI California Labor Market Information Department, the occupational outlook for Barbering is impressive. Currently in the LAOC area, there is an unmet need in this trade. The projections show a 12% increase from 2013 to 2016 with a total of 696 openings.

Using the EDD website below the projections for Barbers shows a 19.6% increase in demand for trained and licensed Barbers.
