Catalog Description:

The Coaching of Sports Certificate of Achievement is designed to prepare students for employment as a coach in the sporting/athletic career field. It is possible to complete this certificate in one calendar year. The curriculum has been designed to equip the student with the background, both theoretical and practical to pursue a job as a coach. Students will be prepared to take the mandatory C.I.F. test for employment. Courses in nutrition, strength and conditioning, first aid or athletic training will prepare the student for responsibilities in the field of

coaching. The intent of this program is to prepare students in field of physical activity so they may pursue a career in coaching. The classes offered will help student as they continue to pursue this career path. The program will prepare students for immediate entry-level employment in the field of coaching.

2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

Local programs such as YMCA, Boy’s and Girl’s Club and recreation departments, middle school and high schools have shown a great interest in the development of this certificate. Those programs feel that this program will help them with hiring qualified candidates.

Advisory Committee:

Prior to the meeting different instructors, coaches, and managers were contacted as to their interest in the certificate and serving on the committee. There was an overall agreement that a certificate was needed. Input was received from people on the committee and those who could not serve but were very interested in seeing this move forward. The main interest was that these coaches be employment ready.

This certificate is designed to train students in the area of coaching sport. The goals are to provide students with the skill and requirements to enter the career of coaching sport. Areas to be covered

1. Injury prevention and response
2. Coaching of sport and responsibilities
3. Strength, conditioning and practice development
4. Nutritional needs of the athlete and problems
5. Social issues, problems and media impact
