This program is designed to prepare the student with a fundamental understanding and acquisition of knowledge in the theater arts discipline with an emphasis on production through set design, construction and costuming with attention to stagecraft, function, and esthetics. To earn an Associate Degree students must complete: (1) all major course requirements with a minimum grade of "C"; (2) 25 units of General Education Graduation Requirements; (3) cultural diversity and reading requirements; (4) any elective courses to complete a minimum of 60 units; and, (5) have a minimum GPA of 2.0. At least 50% of all major course work must be completed at Cypress College. Courses that fulfill major requirements for an Associate Degree at Cypress College might not be the same as those required for completing the major at a transfer institution offering a Baccalaureate Degree. 2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

The Associate in Science Degree Theater Arts Production is an integral part of Theater Arts Program. The courses

contained in this degree will prepare students for production work in the competitive world of theater production and the entertainment sector workplace environment and community settings.

The need for this degree is supported by the current demand in these venues for trained theater production jobs related to costumes, makeup, lighting, audio, properties, technical theater, box office and house management and is consistent with both the college Mission and the Educational Master Plan of the college. The Associate in Science Degree Theater Arts Production option will be offered as an addition to the existing Theater Programs at Cypress College.
