Program Learning Outcomes – Upon completion, students will be able to:

- Apply the elements of and principles of production design with competent skill and technique with video production equipment such as cameras, computer editing software, and projection systems;
- Analyze historical, cultural, and aesthetic factors that led to the development of filmmaking and video production and its incorporation into the performing arts;
- Devise and produce video content in a collaborative production scenario and incorporate content into a live performance event.



2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

More and more, video projection is becoming an integral element of all kinds of live entertainment— professional theatrical productions, concert events, dance performances, corporate events, trade shows, theme parks, and television shows. It can be seen in everything from Broadway shows to Beyoncé concerts to product introduction events to Disneyland spectaculars and *America's Got Talent*. There is a tremendous need, particularly in Los Angeles, for skilled talent in everything from entry-level positions to creative directors. As the skills acquired in this certificate program cover a broad range of disciplines, including communication arts, digital media, entertainment, and visual and performing arts, the job opportunities cover a wide spectrum of the booming creative industry in Los Angeles. According to the 2017 Otis Report on the Creative Economy of the Los Angeles Region, creative industry employees make up 1 in 8 of all salaried workers in the area, with an anticipated growth of 5.1% by 2020. Based on this exhaustive report and the increased presence of video in live entertainment over the past five years, we anticipate an increased demand for trained workers in this technical field.

3. Summarize the Labor Market Information (LMI) and employment outlook (including citation for the source of the data) for students exiting the program. (See PCAH pp. 85-88, 136, 147, 148, 165, 168, and 176)

The Video for Live Entertainment Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for entry-level employment opportunities as Set and Exhibit Designers (SOC #27-1027) among other related occupations. The following summarizes the LMI in LA/Orange County:

- The 2016-2026 job change is projected to be 557 (15% growth). Annual openings are projected to be 154
- Average entry-level wage is \$18.64 (25 %) with a median wage of \$23.57.
- There were 88 regional completions in 2015 in Technical Theatre/Theatre Design and Technology as reported by the EMSI 2017.

With 154 annual job openings and 88 in regional completions there is an annual net demand of 66 annual openings.
