2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

The goal of the Cerritos College Welding Technology program is to train students in entry level welding skills and obtain welding certifications necessary for employment in the industry. The program is one of the largest in the state and offers certifications and licenses to multiple government and state welding codes. The program currently offers five certificates of achievement.

The welding program, under the direction of our industry advisory committee and recommendations from local industry, developed a welding fabrication and layout certificate of achievement in 2008. The department was under the impression that the AA degree was also approved but an audit with the Chancellor's office indicated that the AA option had not been selected when the paperwork was submitted. This proposal corrects this internal error and will allow students who have completed this certificate option and completed the general education requirements to graduate with an AA degree. This new AA degree will give students more career options and will assist local industry by providing them with highly qualified employees.

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EMSI reports that for LA and Orange Counties, including QCEW Employees + Non-QCEW Employees + Self-Employed + Extended Proprietors that there were 10,657 jobs in the area in 2012. The growth is at 2% for 2013 and the median earnings are \$16.35 an hour. This growth will result in an additional 219 jobs. There are currently 527 regional openings and 147 regional program completions. Pomona Unified School District Adult and Career Education has 37 completions, Cerritos College has 27 completions, LA trade tech has 17 completions, El Camino College has 14 completions and Maxine Waters Employment Preparation Center has 12 completions.
