Students completing a Child Development Core certificate are qualified to teach in a private child development program as licensed under Title 22 of the Department of Social Services. It also fulfills the educational requirements for students seeking a California Child Development permit at the Associate Teacher level.

The State of California requires that all teachers of young children in early childhood centers have verification of completion of required college units. For a Title 22 program (private) licensed by the Department of Social Services, teachers must complete twelve core units of child development. For a Title V program (public) licensed through the Department of Education, associate teachers must complete 12 units of child development as partial fulfillment of a California Child Development permit. The Child Development Core Certificate fulfills both these requirements.

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2. Provide a brief rationale for the program.

We have offered this twelve unit certificate since 1975, as it forms the foundation for all subsequent programs of study in Child Development. In 2009, the Chancellor’s Office no longer approved local certificates without formal applications. Between 2009 and 2014, our students have continued to earn these certificates without them being transcribed. We are submitting this certificate for approval, as it is the first tier of educational requirements to enter the workforce. It is required by the Department of Social Services Title 22 for all teachers in private early childhood programs. Additionally, it forms the educational requirement for those students seeking California Child Development permits at the Associate Teacher level in order to qualify for employment in publicly funded programs. This twelve unit certificate is embedded in the higher unit certificates as well as the AS-T degree in Early Childhood Education. It is a critical first step for students entering the field.
