The core courses provide students with managerial skills and theory including communicating, decision-making, organizing, motivating, and human relations. The student can gain practical skills in a specific area by specializing in human resource management, supervision or small business management.

 Santa Ana College has offered a degree in Management since 1970 that leads students on a career path to becoming managers and supervisors. Santa Ana College has also offered a locally approved Management certificate for many years, but in order to be in compliance with the newest Program and Course Approval Handbook, we are applying for the Management certificate to become state approved. This Management certificate provides training that can be applied to any functional area. Students complete the required core courses, and then select two electives that allow them to specialize in the areas of management/supervision that are most relevant to them (accounting, human resources, marketing, etc.).

4. Summarize the Labor Market Information and employment outlook (including citation of the source of the data) for students exiting the program.

According to the Labor Market Information of Estimated Employment and Projected Growth for General and Operations Managers, there are 15,940 projected openings in Los Angeles County and 4,960 projected openings in Orange County over a ten year period (2010-2020). The average number of combined yearly job openings for Los Angeles and Orange counties for General and Operations Managers is estimated to be 2,090. According to the Chancellor's Office Data Mart, the number of completions in 2013-2014 for programs with a TOP code of 050600 Business Management was 801. Therefore 2,090 minus 801 would still result in a Net Annual Labor Demand of 1,289 jobs.
